STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY – Ph.D.

The Ph.D. Program Student Learning Outcomes are derived from the *American Association of Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT) Core Competencies, Association of Marital and Family Therapy Regulatory Boards, AAMFT Code of Ethics, and AAMFT Supervision Handbook.*

- 1. Marital and Family Therapy: Students will demonstrate competence in system and relational practice with diverse clientele.
 - **1.1** Identify a personal "core theory" to guide clinical intervention
 - **1.2** Explore other theories and discover creative ways of accommodating those theories with the "core theory."
 - **1.3** Facilitate the co-evolving therapist-client relationship.
 - **1.4** Evaluate and identify problems in therapist-client relationships.
 - **1.5** Demonstrate sensitivity to contextual variables such as culture, gender, ethnicity and economics.
 - **1.6** Identify and develop an area of clinical expertise.
- **2. Clinical Supervision:** Students will develop competency in supervision that is sensitive to issues of diversity.
 - **2.1** Demonstrate that they think about treatment and supervision in relational terms (for example, in terms of patterns sequence, context).
 - **2.2** Demonstrate awareness of patterns and sequences of replication at various system levels (for example, interconnection and interrelationships of the individual, family, therapist, supervisor and context of training).
 - **2.3** Demonstrate a clear theoretical orientation by articulating his/her philosophies of therapy and supervision as well as the clear connection between them.
 - **2.4** Demonstrate theoretical consistency, whether from one prominent model or from an integrative perspective with a logical integration of models.
 - **2.5** Present a rationale for the choice of supervisory methods and how the methods facilitate achievement of supervision goals.
 - **2.6** Demonstrate sensitivity to contextual variables such as culture, gender, biology, ethnicity, family of origin and economics.
 - **2.7** Demonstrate knowledge of ethical and legal issues of supervision.
- **3. Teaching:** Students will demonstrate competency in teaching.
 - **3.1** Demonstrate overall effectiveness as a teacher.
 - **3.2** Demonstrate that they are well prepared for class.
 - **3.3** Demonstrate competence in subject matter taught.
 - **3.4** Demonstrate that course content, including assigned readings are current and represent the most up to date information on the subject.

- **4. Research:** Students will demonstrate knowledge and skills as a researcher in the field of Marriage and Family Therapy through their work on their dissertation.
 - **4.1** Demonstrate progress toward developing a personal research agenda.
 - **4.2** Demonstrate ability to design sound MFT research.
 - **4.3** Conduct research in an ethical manner.
 - **4.4** Create conceptual models to summarize and/or inform research.
 - **4.5** Create new knowledge for the field by completing a dissertation on a MFT topic.
- **5. Research Productivity:** Students will publish in professional journals and present research at conferences.
- **6. Service and Professionalism:** Students will demonstrate commitment to service and professional involvement.
 - **6.1** Maintain membership with a professional organization.
 - **6.2** Pass MFT Licensing Exam.
 - **6.3** Demonstrate commitment to leadership and/or professional activities.
