Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at an accredited two-year college. *Maximum of 62 credits from a two-year institution.

Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State. Further, the student must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credits at K-State. A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or above

This is not a requirement for the Public Health Nutrition program.

To become a registered dietitian (RD) requires enrollment in the CADE-accredited dietetics education program at K-State that requires admission to either the Coordinated Program in Dietetics or the Didactic Program in Dietetics. Contact the Department of Hotel, Restaurant, Institution Management and Dietetics (104 Justin Hall) for admission requirements and deadlines.

Application for admission to the *DIDACTIC PROGRAM* is completed during the semester HRIMD 341 Principles of Food Production Management is taken.

Application for the *COORDINATED PROGRAM* is completed during the semester prior to the supervised practice experience (management or clinical).
