

GUIDELINES FOR THE SELECTION OF OUTSTANDING SENIORS

Approved by the CHE Student Affairs Committee, November 14, 1986

Reaffirmed by the CHE Student Affairs Committee, February 9, 1989

The Student Affairs Committee approved the following guidelines for the Outstanding Senior Award. The actual selection process will be up to individual departments.

The Outstanding Senior Award is not designed to recognize academic achievement alone, but rather to recognize students who combine a strong academic performance with professional growth and development, and service to others.

A maximum of one student may be recognized in each area each semester. However, the department is not required to make awards in all areas.

The following guidelines have been developed by the Student Affairs Committee to help departments establish the criteria by which they will make the Outstanding Senior Award(s).

A. **Academic Achievement**

A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 is suggested, or as determined by the department or area.

B. **Leadership, Participation and Service** in activities such as

Departmental organizations
College organizations and committees
Campus organizations and committees
State/national/international organizations and committees
Professional organizations
Community service

C. **Professional potential**

Enthusiasm for field of study
Commitment to the profession
Applicable professional experience (e.g., internships, practica)
Research and creative endeavor in the field of study
