

Hulsing Mentoring Prize

The Hulsing Mentoring Prize recognizes a faculty member in the College of Human Ecology for exceptional mentoring of undergraduate and graduate students. It is the intent of this prize to acknowledge a faculty member for her/his outstanding mentoring of students in any or all areas of leadership:

- Research
- Scholarship
- Creative Activities
- Discovery
- Service

* Extra weight will be given to excellence in the mentoring of undergraduate students.

A prize of ~\$3,000 will be awarded; 25% of which will be a cash prize to the faculty member and the remaining 75% is to be used at the discretion of the winner to support his/her mentoring, teaching, scholarship, and service activities (DRA).

ELIGIBILITY:

All personnel in the College of Human Ecology with a faculty appointment (tenure track or non-tenure track) and 3 years of continuous employment (at the time of submission) in the college (minimum of 0.1 FTE) are eligible.

REQUIRED SUBMISSION MATERIALS:

1. A statement (<500 words) responding to the question: Why do you mentor students?
2. A narrative of the nominee's experience mentoring students which addresses the criteria (below) and other relative information in any or all areas of leadership, RSCAD, and/or service (no more than 5 pages)
3. 2-5 Letters of support from students, current or former, regarding the nominee's mentorship in any or all areas of leadership, RSCAD, and/or service
4. A letter of support from the nominee's Department Head/School Director regarding the nominee's mentorship of students in leadership, RSCAD, and/or service.

Optional 1-2 Letters from peers regarding the nominee's mentorship of students in any or all of the areas of leadership, RSCAD, and/or service.

CRITERIA BY WHICH THE APPLICATION WILL BE EVALUATED:

- Clearly articulated statement by the faculty member regarding why she/he mentors students.
- Evidence of the exceptional mentoring of students that exceeds what would be typically expected of a faculty member.
- Evidence of outstanding mentoring of undergraduate students.
- Demonstrated student impact reflected in the students' personal growth and/or professional development.
- Sustained excellence in mentoring as shown with examples of students mentored over the course of one's career.
- Positive impact of the faculty member's mentoring on the reputation and visibility of his/her respective discipline, unit, and/or the College of Human Ecology
