Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at an accredited two-year college.*

Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State. Further, the student must complete 20 of the last 30 Hours of resident credit at K-State. A minimum of 45 Hours must be at a course level of 300 or above.

BUSINESS MINOR

Students can complete requirements for a business minor concurrent with completion of requirements for the B.S. in Hotel and Restaurant Management. Following are the requirements for the business minor.

- To graduate in another K-State College.
- Complete the fifteen credit hours of business courses listed below. Students are responsible for meeting the prerequisites for each course.
- Students entering Kansas State University Fall 2001 or after must achieve a grade point average of 2.50 or better in each of the five courses that comprise the minor.
- At least three of the five business courses for the business minor must be taken at Kansas State University. The College of Business Administration determines application of any transfer courses within the minor. Consult the College of Business Administration before taking transfer courses to be applied in the minor.
- Obtain and complete a minor declaration form from the College of Business Administration's Student Services office.
