Note: The College of Human Ecology requires a “C” or higher in “Professional Studies” courses, and the K-State 8 requirements must be met. Grade of “CR” required for HDFS 102.

Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at an accredited two-year college. *Maximum of 60 credits from a two-year institution.

Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State. Further, the student must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credits at K-State. A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or above.

****Certified Family Life Educator:**

This certification can be completed by doing either track in HDFS (Internship vs Area of Concentration). Each track has a different procedure for applying. Make sure to check with your advisor to determine which track is right for you.
