POSITIONS: One year Instructor, 9-month, 100% time

RESPONSIBILITIES: The successful candidate will be expected to teach on campus and on-line courses as required for the CFP Board Registered Programs core curriculum in the Personal Financial Planning B.S., M.S., and graduate certificate programs. Teaching load will be 3 to 4 courses per semester. Course releases may be provided based on time dedicated to support structured student activities. Other responsibilities include providing service to the unit, college, and university.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS: (a) Master's degree in Personal Financial Planning, Consumer Economics, Finance, or a closely related field; (b) demonstrated content expertise to teach core classes in the Personal Financial Planning program; (c) ability to work effectively with undergraduate and graduate students in a multidisciplinary environment.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Preference will be given to candidates who (a) possess professional practice experience in the financial planning/services profession; (b) possess experience teaching and developing courses in a distance based environment; (c) hold a CFP® designation or demonstrate a commitment to obtain a CFP® designation; (d) hold active membership in relevant professional organizations, such as the Association for Financial Counseling and Planning Education, Financial Planning Association, Financial Therapy Association, and similar organizations; (e) have earned, or are in the process of earning, a Ph.D. in Personal Financial Planning, Consumer Economics, Finance, or a closely related field

UNIVERSITY INFORMATION: Kansas State University is a comprehensive, research, land grant institution with an enrollment of approximately 21,400 students in eight colleges and the graduate school. The College of Human Ecology has 104 faculty serving approximately 2,300 students through four departments and one school. The multidisciplinary School of Family Studies and Human Services consists of 55 faculty, 25 staff, 700 undergraduate students, 155 master's students, and 67 doctoral students.

COLLEGE INFORMATION:

The College of Human Ecology is committed to the advancement, application, and dissemination of knowledge about the human needs of individuals, families, and communities. Faculty and student research promotes health and well-being in all facets of human life. Expertise areas within the college include personal financial planning, couple and family therapy, speech-

language pathology, textiles, interior design, family science, gerontology, dietetics, kinesiology, athletic training, human nutrition, sensory analysis, and hospitality management.

SCHOOL INFORMATION: The K-State School of Family Studies and Human Services is dedicated to making a difference in the lives of individuals and families. The School is one of seven academic units in the College of Human Ecology and consists of nine units each with lead coordinators: Communication Sciences and Disorders, Conflict Resolution, Early Childhood Education, Family Studies, Life Span Human Development, Marriage and Family Therapy, Personal Financial Planning, and Family Studies and Human Services Extension. The School is extensively involved in distance education at the bachelor's, master's, and doctoral levels and through certificate programs. Faculty, staff and supervised students provide direct services and outreach to enhance the health and wellbeing of individuals and families through an early childhood laboratory school, a speech and hearing clinic, a couple and family therapy clinic, a financial therapy clinic, and a community mediation services program. The School's facilities span five campus buildings and two campuses.

UNIT INFORMATION: The Personal Financial Planning unit at Kansas State University offers three degree programs (B.S., M.S., and Ph.D.) registered with Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards, Inc. and two graduate certificate programs (Personal Financial Planning and Financial Therapy). The doctoral program is a hybrid program; students take courses online during the fall and spring semesters, and participate in 10-day intensive courses on campus in August and an international experience in their final summer. The Personal Financial Planning program consists of approximately 80 undergraduate, 30 certificate, 50 masters, and 40 doctoral students.

SALARY: A competitive salary, commensurate with qualifications and experience, will be provided.

Although not guaranteed, this position has the potential to be converted to a tenure-track position.
