- A total of 120 hours is needed to graduate with a minimum of 45 hours at 300 level or higher
- Kinesiology majors must receive a C or better in all KINESIOLOGY Courses
- Kinesiology majors must finish with a 2.2 GPA in KINESIOLOGY Courses
- Additional KINESIOLOGY courses may be offered in the Summer on demand

All students must complete the K-State 8 requirements taking one course in each of the 8 areas including aesthetic experience, empirical reasoning, ethical reasoning, global issues, historical perspectives, human diversity, natural and physical sciences, and social sciences. A minimum of four different course prefixes (e.g., ANTH, MATH, HDFS) must be represented in the fulfillment of the K-State 8 requirements.

Humanities electives selected carefully can fulfill the aesthetic interpretation and historical perspectives K-State 8 requirements.

NOTE: (1) The letters in parenthesis following courses indicate the term in which each class is typically offered. Course offerings may vary from semester to semester.
